

OUTBACK BY AIR



SYDNEY - LOUTH

Our crew welcome you at Bankstown Airport (Sydney) before departing on this exciting Outback adventure. Take in the views from a completely different perspective. Our Cessna Grand Caravan's high wings and oversized windows are perfect for "flight seeing".

We fly northwest to the Outback town of Bourke, where we visit the Back O' Bourke Exhibition Centre. Set amongst a native garden of river red gums on the banks of the mighty Darling River, this modern museum showcases the fascinating local wool and riverboat history of the region.

After lunch we track the Darling to the bush town of Louth. A dirt road leads us to Trilby Station, a family owned 320,000 acre sheep property. This overnight stay focuses on offering the true Australian Outback station experience. The Murray Family has lived in the area for seven generations, grazing merino sheep since 1860, and a glimpse into their way of life is not often accessible to outsiders. Our host, Liz, will take guests on a walking tour of the state-of-the-art shearing shed and aircraft hangar, while giving us an overview of life on a remote sheep station.

Immerse yourself in the landscape, appreciating a bush sunset with drinks and canapés by the billabong.

Today we swap our wings for wheels and set off in our private transport for a day of exploring. Soak up the Outback big sky scenery as we head to the Age of Dinosaurs experience, painting a picture of what this area looked like 90 million years ago. Witness the monumental March of the Titanosaurs exhibition where we will see a recently discovered 54m sauropod track site!

Enjoy lunch at the Waltzing Matilda Centre in Winton, surrounded by the story of Banjo Patterson's famous ballad.

We join fifth generation farmer, Outback Dan Walker, at Camden Park Station, for sundowners in the paddock before returning to the Qantas Museum for the spectacular light and sound show. This experience is designed to delight and entertain. Stand amongst iconic aircraft as world class projection mapping and 360-degree immersive sound brings the 100-year-old story of Qantas to life.

Relax with drinks and dinner at The Longreach Station before retiring to The Retreat.



BIRDSVILLE - ULURU

Foxtrot Tango Tango flies us across the Simpson Desert to the spiritual heart of Australia, Uluru. "The Rock" which was formed over 350 million years ago was once covered by sea.

"Around 500 million years ago the whole area was covered in sea. Sand and mud fell to the bottom and covered the seabed, including these fans. The weight of the new seabed turned the fans into rock. The sandy fan became sandstone (Uluru) while the rocky fan became conglomerate rock (Kata Tjuta).

400 million years ago the sea disappeared. The rocks folded and tilted as the earth's tectonic plates shifted. Kata Tjuta tilted slightly and Uluru tilted 90 degrees. Over the last 300 million years, the softer rocks eroded away, leaving the spectacular forms of Uluru and Kata Tjuta behind." - *Source: Parks Australia*

Get set for an evening of delight with the breathtaking Sounds of Silence Dinner experience. Admire the ever changing colour of the rock as the sun sets. Indulging in canapes and sparkling wine overlooking spectacular Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park, this evening will be one to remember.

As the night sky twinkles to life, we will be welcomed to an interactive chef's station where we will be served a freshly prepared bush tucker inspired menu incorporating native bush ingredients, all accompanied by Australian wine and star gazing with our local guide.

ULURU - WILLIAM CREEK

We have an early start to make the most of the unrivalled sunrise in the World Heritage listed Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park. With Uluru basking in the light as a new day begins, experience the sunrise with a guided drive around the base of The Rock.

As we travel towards Uluru its vast shape rises from the sand dunes as the early dawn light highlights its presence. Our guide will take us to a special location with uninterrupted views to watch the sunrise over this amazing monolith as we enjoy a picnic breakfast. We visit the Mutitjulu Waterhole to learn the creation stories of Liru (venomous snake) and Kuniya (Python).

We track toward the remote town of William Creek (population 10) on the famous Oodnadatta Track. This evening we dine at the authentic bush pub, The William Creek Hotel. This pub is loved by travellers from all around the world, with a front bar decorated by hundreds of notes, memorabilia and mementos.

WILLIAM CREEK - BROKEN HILL

Witness mesmerising views of Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre, Australia's largest salt lake, as we track towards Broken Hill.

Look out for the enigmatic Marree Man - a remarkable 2.7 km long drawing of an aboriginal hunter. It is one of the largest geoglyphs in the world but its origin remains a mystery, with no one claiming responsibility for its creation!

Take in the spectacular ruggedness of the Flinders Ranges and the beauty of Lake Frome - a dessert-like mélange of gold earth and swirling white salt pans, an amazing sight from above.

Upon landing in The Silver City experience a rich and historical private guided tour of Broken Hill and its local delights.

Drinks at the colourful Palace Hotel is a must, made famous by the Priscilla Queen of the Desert movie before dinner and gin tasting at the Tydvil Hotel.



BROKEN HILL - SYDNEY

Our final morning is spent at the interactive Royal Flying Doctor Museum which celebrates the history of the Flying Doctor, including its doctors, pilots and nurses.

The base at Broken Hill is unique because it is one of the only working RFDS bases.

The Caravan is back in the sky, heading to the Outback post of Tilpa.

Our farewell lunch is at the Tilpa Hotel, considered one of the last remaining true bush pubs in Australia. Established in 1894 to service the river boat trade the pub is a classic, character-filled hotel made of corrugated iron and timber.
